Alexandre est membre de la commission présidentielle dite Attali II sur l'Économie Positive, où il est co-rapporteur pour l'indice de positivité. La Fabrique est un des 12 principaux think-tank français, nommé par Acteurs Public, Correspondant officiel en France d'un projet hébergé par l'OCDE sur la mesure du bien-être sociétal Wikiprogress, rédacteur-coordonnateur de

la Commission de l'ONU de mise en oeuvre de la résolution de l'Assemblée Générale du 19 juillet 2011, visant à faire du bien-être citoyen un objectif du développement. Elle rassemble 200 citoyens actifs dans 22 villes en France. Elle est à l'origine d'initiatives comme le Pacte Spinoza, les Bienveilleurs au Travail, l'Université du Bonheur au Travail, les Ateliers du Bonheur à l'Ecole, etc. Elle est co-créatrice des premières Master Class sur l'Entreprise Positive à l'Ecole Centrale Paris et intervenante dans le 1^{er} Master International de Psychologie Positive en France.

Alexandre Jost is the founder and full-time chairman of the Paris-based think-tank La Fabrique Spinoza (the Spinoza Factory), the French think-tank for citizens' well-being. As such, it organizes and promotes research and democratic debate on citizens' well-being, and makes public policy as well as recommendations to the civil society in its favor. Declared one of the 12 leading French think-tanks by Acteurs Publics, the Spinoza Factory is Correspondent in France of the Wikiprogress initiative, hosted by the OECD, for the measure of societal progress and well-being. Its research areas include education, governance, work, health, time, philanthropy, medias, gender equality, indicators, public service, town planning.

Alexandre has been giving 25 conferences on societal applications of happiness and well-being science in the past year, from schools, to political campuses, to businesses, to academic seminars.

Bhutan Minister of Labor Dorji Wangdi has distinguished Alexandre for his work towards happiness at Sète in France in September 2011. Also in September, Alexandre was declared “a revelation” by the French economic magazine “Challenges”. He has given a dozen interviews in major French national medias (20 minutes, France Inter, Le Mouv', Challenges, Europe 1, etc.) in the past year. He has been mentoring 2 rising talents of the Women's Forum in Deauville in October 2011. He was the Laureate of the Andersen Consulting Strategy consulting award in 2000 at U.C. Berkeley. Since April 2nd 2012, he has been a deputy director of the civil society group for Planning and Strategy, with the U.N., for the implementation of resolution 65/309 on “Happiness as a holistic approach to development”.

Alexandre is also an associate at the Ecole Centrale Paris department for social innovation, where he manages collective projects with engineering students, in relation to happiness science and its applications to society.

Alexandre graduated from Ecole Centrale Paris in 2000 with a Master of Science in Industrial Engineering. He also obtained a Master of Science in Operations Research at University of California at Berkely.

He then worked as a consultant for the leading international strategy consultancy Mars & Co until 2006, coordinating consulting projects in various sectors from IT, to non-profit, to Utilities, Franchises, Consumer goods (etc.) on various topics: value-chain optimization, M&A, development strategy, cost reduction, customer demand building.

He moved to the non-profit sector (healthcare and social care) and worked there from 2006 to 2011, at the Groupe SOS, the 3rd largest French NGO (10,000 employees). He took on several positions, from head of Research & Development, to deputy managing director for G&A and

Strategy, and finally deputy managing director for the “Dependance sector” (sector of medical and social centers for the disabled and the elderly). As such, he was part of the board of managing directors.

He founded the “Happiness diners” in 2008, regularly hosting and facilitating happiness science conferences with leading experts on happiness and well-being. He then created the Fabrique Spinoza in 2011, and as full-time chairman, overviews happiness and well-being science developments and the Scientific Council of the think-tank.

His work experiences have allowed him to live and work in various locations: Japan, US, Mexico, Brazil, U.K., France; hence learning the languages of these different countries.
